problem solving and autonomy the purpose of this qualitative case study was to explore how educational stakeholders at Walter High School including students parents and educators perceived the relationship between a senior capstone project and student capacities in regards to critical thinking inquiry problem solving and autonomy five learning theories guided the study including Bloom's taxonomy of learning theory Bloom's mastery learning theory cognitive and affective learning theory 21st century learning theory and constructivist learning theory the study's sample and methodology consisted of interviews with 12 parents a focus group with 10 educators and analysis of 12 student capstone projects stakeholders perceived that as students applied critical thinking inquiry and problem solving they also became more engaged organized and empowered as a result of completing the senior capstone project in terms of student autonomy perceptions from stakeholders indicated the capstone project made students more independent and determined parents thought their students were better leaders
